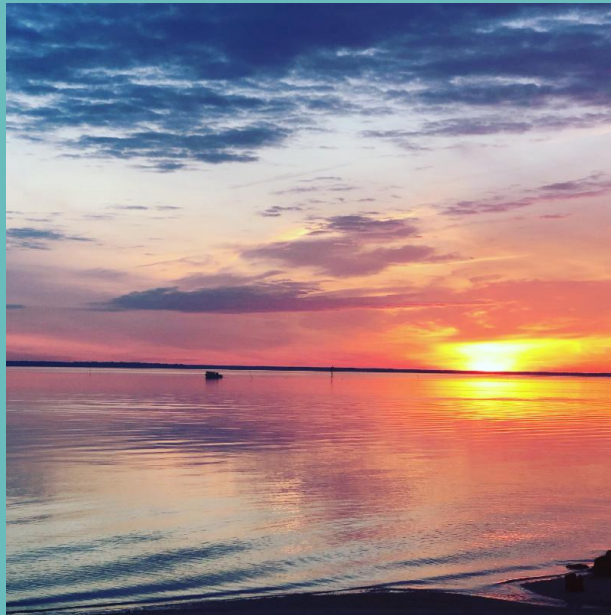

Community Awards



This year, the Colonial Beach Community Foundation (CBCF) is starting a new tradition -- a fundraising gala coupled with a community awards ceremony. The gala, which also celebrates CBCF's 15th anniversary, will be held October 17. Three categories of awards will recognize

individuals or groups (e.g., nonprofits; civic, school, social, or church groups; public entities; businesses; etc.) who make a difference in our

community.

Award Categories

Community awards will recognize achievements in the following three categories:

- **Community Beautification.** This award recognizes those working to enhance the appearance of our public places, be it a park, business, beach, the boardwalk ... any public or public-gathering place that improves the look of Colonial Beach as a whole.
- **Cultural Enhancement.** This award recognizes those who enrich the cultural, artistic, or historical nature of Colonial Beach ... those things that make us who we are.
- **Community Well-Being.** This award recognizes those who work to improve the health, safety, happiness or general welfare of our community members.

Nominations

Nominations will be accepted March 9th through March 31st. The CBCF board will review the nominations between April and June and select this year's recipient of the award in each category. Awards will be presented at this year's 1st Annual Gala.

Anyone may nominate an individual or group for an award. Simply send an email to info@cbcommunityfoundation.org, type Award Nominee in the subject line, and include the following information in the body of your email:

- Your full name and telephone number.
- The name of the person or group you are nominating and the appropriate award category. If possible, include contact information.
- One to three paragraphs explaining why the individual or group deserves the award in that category.

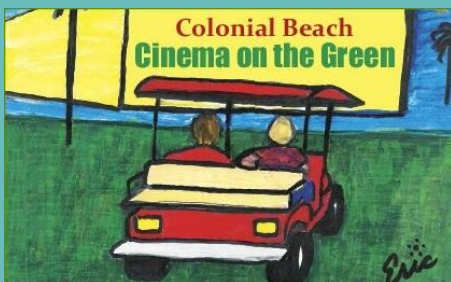
