Town Council Candidates Forum

The Foundation and Colonial Beach Chamber of Commerce are sponsoring a **Town Council Candidates Forum on Tuesday, October 19, from 6 until 9 PM, at Colonial Beach Elementary School (102 First St) in the gym**. This forum gives residents an opportunity to learn about the candidates running for Town Council and ask questions, which must be submitted in advance. **Submit questions to the Chamber at** *info@colonialbeach.org* no later than noon, Monday, October **18**.



Last year, two seats on Town Council opened up with the election of Council member Robin Schick as Mayor and the resignation of Council member Patrick Ey, both of whom had been elected to a 4-year term in 2018. Earlier this year, Town Council appointed Kenneth Allison and Powell Duggan to temporiarliy fill those

vacant seats. This November 2, Town residents will select two candidates to complete the term. Candidates on the ballot are Kenneth Allison, Andrea Clement, and David Williams; Maggie Lane is running as a write-in candidate.

NNK Beach Festival & BAMM Concert Successes

After weeks of almost unbearably hot weather, the first two weekends in September brought us sunny skies, low humidity, and moderate temperatures to enjoy the Northern Neck (NNK) Beach Music Festival and the Beach, Arts, Music, & Mentoring (BAMM) Concert Fundraiser.

We had a good time listening to great music, hanging out with friends, dancing, and enjoying food and drink ... but most importantly, we raised money for good causes that benefit our community. The counts are not quite final as a few receipts and invoices still need to come in, but these are pretty good estimates:

- The Foundation's NNK Beach Music Festival and Building Community Raffle raised approximately \$20,000. Diana Pearson won the \$5,000 raffle and donated a portion of her winnings back to the Foundation. Proceeds from the Festival and Raffle will go toward Town-wide beautification efforts in the form of grants. We will provide information on how organizations can apply for beautification grants soon.
- BAMM's concert raised approximately \$13,000, which will benefit Colonial Beach schools, teachers, and students and help enhance the lives of the kids in Colonial Beach.




Osprey Farewell Party




