WWER's mission is "to deliver programming that serves and supports Colonial Beach in ways that commercial stations do not, by broadcasting unique, local programs that inform and engage both residents and visitors." Station Manager Ted Tait says to expect a general music mix during the week, a more

upbeat beach mix for the weekend, and several specialty shows that both entertain and inform.

WWER is a non-commercial station and, in true Colonial Beach spirit, the voices behind the microphone belong to volunteers. We are fortunate to have broadcast professionals among our full- and part-time residents, who are willing to bring radio to us as a "labor of love" for both radio and Colonial Beach.
